3(d). Runs to incorporate a place of interest as a venue, e.g. Winery, Saw Mill, Cheese factory.

Suggestions –

- (1) Meet at a Club for Breakfast & then on to a place of interest.
- (2) 'Mystery Trip' – weekend away, using Club cars rather than moderns. Community based run – e.g. Cancer Patients or aged care – take them for a drive and have morning or afternoon tea with them.
- (3) Get members to draw up a run at which other members could say yes or no to it – for instance – living and working on the Sunshine Coast, being a local, may know more places to visit.

7 What start time suits most members – i.e., 0800, 0830, 0900, 0930 hours

- 2 members for 0800 start and 2 members for 0800 start in summer
- 10 members for 0830 start and 2 for 0830 in summer and 1 for 0830 in winter
- 3 members for 0900 start and 3 members for 0900 start in winter
- No members voted for a 0930 start

11 Any suggestions for type of Fun Run

- (1) Night run and BBQ/Dinner. Ladies Day - Chicken & Champagne - all ladies free
- (2) A bowls day at a Bowls Club or a Ten Pin bowls day at a Ten Pin Bowling Alley. Fishing comp, kite comp.
- (3) "Poker Run" in aid of local charity. 5 cards to collect in sealed envelopes, not to be opened until final stop. Start, destination and 3 interim stops. Prizes – Best Hand, Second Best and Worst Hand. Tied hands settled by cutting the pack.
- (4) Let members organise monthly runs and we will get variety. Just promote creativity

14. BBQ's could incorporate, sausage sizzle, Hamburgers, steaks (list your preference below)

- (1) Leave as is now
- (2) Alternate BBQ & BYO
- (3) Sometimes a Lunch venue for a change
- (4) For Steak BBQ, people could choose, BYO or pay fixed amount for Steak or Burger

15 Alternate meet/start venue other than Sundowner e.g. Centenary Lakes, etc. with possibly a pre run general meeting instead of the traditional lunch time meeting.

- (1) Pre run meetings do help those who have other commitments, i.e. children functions, sports etc. As we are only able to go periodically we are happy to go along with whatever the majority want.
- (2) Must have somewhere with fuel, toilets and sit down tea/coffee while waiting for rest to show up, i.e. BP Caboolture.
- (3) Not really interested in meetings to be held prior to run – people may not like to get all their tables/chairs out prior to the run.
- (4) Maybe shorten meeting at the Rally so more socialising and other fun things can be done.
- (5) Alternate meet – starting point only if plenty of area for parking, etc. Centenary Lakes – YES
- (6) Yes – meeting first would be great
- (7) Meetings are fine as they are – at lunch time, and the Sundowner starting point is as good a place as any to start. Several of us have a Macca's breakfast which we have been doing for years. If it ain't broke, why fix it? It is an excellent starting point as there is highway access north and south. At the Lakes there would be traffic problems. Much easier as it is.
- (8) Need to think about access & exit safety. Sundowners have breakie and caffeine fix option available at Macca's
- (9) Centenary Lakes with pre run meeting or evening meeting. People interested would still attend.
- (10) No, it would make start too late
- (11) Alternating start venues is a bad idea. Choose one and stick to it. Put it to the members if you want to host the meeting before the run starts, but this should be consistent. Personally we think having the meeting at lunchtime is the way to go. This allows members to join in the run along the route and still attend the meeting and have their say.

Other Comments in General:

- *Distance/Radius from Caboolture*
 - Approximate distance to be in Club magazine and finish time - All okay as long as the meeting is within reasonable reach of all members – i.e. within 150 to 200km of Caboolture.
- *Additional runs other than monthly run*
 - End up at Pub for lunch – i.e. Sea view Hotel Monday-Friday cheap lunch. Monday & Tuesdays free Pool Table – have Pool Comp
 - Friday night two or three times a year.
 - Les Arnold started some mid-week runs a few years ago but after the first 2 or three I think they died. He was the only one organising them. Give it another go - but midweek runs have been tried numerous times with no success. Other types, yes – as long as the meeting is still close enough for all members to attend. Costs of these 'extra' events should be incurred by those attending, not CHACC.
- *Organised activities after the meeting –*
 - Disc bowls comp in park during or at end of run, Bocchie, Cricket, Bowls - Occasionally, although I have to get home ASAP to prepare the SCN and get ready for the next working week (we aren't all retired).
- *Rally Sheet filled out listing participants prior to departure Sundowner*
 - No, impossible due to time restraints
 - Yes, and checked off on arrival at meeting
 - No, not possible
 - Does not matter
 - Hmm, what for? Attendance records are for official meeting purposes.

- *Should we have more combined runs in conjunction with other Clubs?*
 - *Maybe one a year.*
 - Yes, where possible. These runs have been successful in the past
 - Have a guest speaker occasionally
- *Should morning/afternoon tea stops be incorporated into longer runs?*
 - All runs – shorter ones 1 break only
- *“Tail-End Charlie”*
 - Only on long overnight runs.
 - Most cars can do runs and should be roadworthy.
 - Most will help others
 - Each driver try to keep the following driver in sight on runs
 - OK, but mobile phones and a CHACC mobile list in your glove box is better. If you don't have a phone in your car , don't leave last!
- *Make it obligatory for all members to attend at least 2 runs per year to retain their membership?*
 - Sorry, can't answer questions as yet to attend run (car problems) – however all sound like good options
- *Trivia questions or questions about the route?*
 - Both. But not too hard, just silly ones.
 - Yes – we always have done this and it is very popular. You always get some hilarious responses.
- *Smorgasbord* - Unhealthy for chilled food and too much garbage food put on the table.
- Anyone organising a run must drive over run prior to the day, to make sure of good directions.
- Points for attendance awarded during the year
 - OK, but should be voted on by members of course.
- *Start Time*
 - Consistency is a bloody good idea – so why even change this?
- *Re: Poker Run*
 - Yes, great.
 - When member's had the opportunity to organise monthly runs, this was done at least twice in the past few years.
- *Volunteer to assist BBQ if nominted?*
 - Possibly, who is doing the nominating?
 - There is always plenty of opportunity to call for volunteers on the day. People will volunteer on the day as proven in the past.
- *Host new member?*
 - Yes, as long as they are cool dudes and shout me beers all day, then drive me home.
- Adding new events and things are great, but making them work as a club event is another issue. You will find that something's will not succeed – that's ok. Just remember that **we are here for the love of old cars.** People from all walks of life join this club for the love of old cars and want to keep them on the road as much as possible – hence Club rego. All other club social events are just bonuses.
