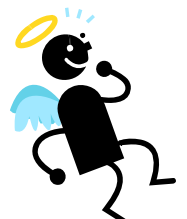
Cars in Heaven

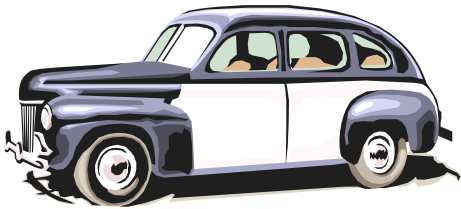

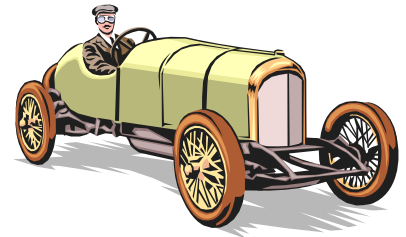
