INFORMATION FOR 6Y RALLY

Sunday 9th September

BYO morning tea and lunch

As usual, we will meet at Sundowner by 8.30am for a 9.00am departure to the 2/14th Light Horse Museum, Gallipoli Barracks in Enoggera (all areas are wheelchair accessible).

This year is the 90th anniversary of the only great mounted infantry charge in history, the charge of Beersheba. This charge differs from any Calvary charge in that the Australian soldiers were Mounted Infantry and therefore did not have sabres or lances, only their 18 inch bayonets in hand and rifle slung over their backs.

Once we arrive outside the barracks in Lloyd Street, we will regroup to enter together. Our guide for the day will be Captain Adele Horsburgh. Adele is also a classic car enthusiast and a proud Zephyr owner. We will be escorted to park our vehicles at the Royal Australian Regiment Memorial Walk where we will have morning tea and inspect the memorial which is dedicated all Australian soldiers lost in battle. After morning tea, we will be escorted in our vehicles to the 2/14th museum for a guided tour. Here we will experience the history of this famous Australian regiment with displays ranging from 1860-1942, covering colonial times, the Boer War, WW1 and militia days and hopefully we will be lucky enough to have the opportunity to inspect an ASLAV (modern eight wheeled amphibious armoured vehicle).

For military security reasons, all attendee's names and the exact number of vehicles attending MUST be provided to me to be forwarded onto the Garrison for clearance no later than Thursday 30th of August.

If you do not receive your confirmation email within 24 hours, you MUST phone me to confirm in case the email was lost. NO UNLISTED PEOPLE will be allowed through the barrack's gates. The gate security will ONLY allow those who are on the list to enter the barracks. We already have around 25 people registered, so please if you are interested, don't forget to RSVP.
