Badges cost \$16-95, being sold for \$15-00, Chambray Shirts cost \$37-30, being sold for \$34-00, T-Shirts cost \$30-50, being sold for \$27-00. NASCO NOS Flashing light bulbs

These bulbs are 'new old stock' (NOS) and were factory fitted as a 'handbrake warning light' to some 1960's Holdens (EJ - Premier; EH - Premier & S4 series; HD/HR Premier and X2 series). They were also factory fitted to some 60s and 70s USA GM models.

These bulbs have an internal, bi-metallic strip that flexes, causing them to flash randomly once warmed up by the tungsten element. They fit a standard small automotive bulb socket and can be used in any 12 volt electric system easily.

These globes have not been manufactured since the 1970s and are unavailable anywhere else in the world as far as I have researched.
