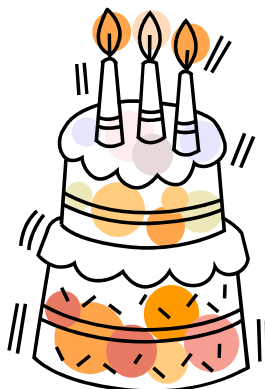

We already have quite a number of members who have paid for the lunch and put their names down for the Xmas dinner. Shirley & Gillian have done quite a bit of ground work for these events so hopefully you will all support them. Both events will be subsidised by the Club.

Okay - you all know our aims of CHACC - 'to bring together persons with a common interest to encourage the use, maintenance and preservation of motor vehicles of classic and historic classification without prejudice to make, model, method of manufacture or country or origin. As well

as vehicles of special interest, this may, from time to time be determined by the committee.' Wow – that's a mouth full isn't it?! Well, I am thinking what is wrong with broadening this scope to the auspice of our community!

To expand, I received an email a few days ago from a mum with a 10 year old son who needs help. Cheryl Warner, from Bribie Island has a son, Beau, who has had diabetes since he was 2 years old. It has progressed to the stage whereby he now needs six insulin injections a day, thus resulting in him being unable to attend school unless he gets an insulin pump. He has missed nearly a whole year of school because of this disease – and no he is not 'obese' – in fact he looks quite lean for his age. Mum is on a disability pension and has no private health insurance. She has gone out to the community clubs to beg for assistance so Beau can resume a normal life. After checking out details on her email – i.e., the Diabetes Support Group, etc. and confirming this was a legitimate plea for help, I put this email out to the Committee first as it was after our last meeting, and after our last Rally meeting. We have had some great suggestions, which I will list below. However if any member has any further input, please let us know. I know we are a small Club and can't come up with the \$8,000 needed for this pump; maybe we could contribute in some way to assist Mum and Beau. The Diabetes Support group are holding a raffle/auction in July to assist, but there are two other adult diabetics in need of an insulin pump – therefore it is a big ask. Our thoughts to date, and we put these to the members for consent and/or further ideas, are:

- i) *I would make the suggestion that the monies raised at the next 3 rallies be matched by the Club and the combined amount be donated. This should be a reasonable amount – around \$500-\$600.*
- ii) *Given we have already given \$200 to the Leukaemia Foundation and we only have \$250 in our budget for Donations, we do have money in the Bank we think this is a just cause. Even a hundred or two hundred dollars and we could maybe publicise the fact in all the local papers, which would be good public relations for the Club.*
- iii) *Maybe we go and buy something worth \$50 or \$60 dollars and do a Special raffle for this child – the Club would dip out that Rally on the proceeds and monies could go to him.*
- iv) *Will go along with a \$500 donation, it could save a child's life and it is great when mother decided to look around for help. We have been asked "why save money", this is a great reason.*
- v) *If we can afford to give money that's okay or if they all would like to hold a raffle but we would have to have something really nice as a prize.*
- vi) *For what it is worth, I think the idea of a special raffle is a brilliant idea, something "car" related that all members could use for their cars, plus a bonus one for the wife????? But also a small, as u say \$100 to \$200 donation from the Club.*
- vii) *If we are able to assist, then we should. If there's not much in the Budget, what about doing a 'whip round with the 'hat' at our next run? Getting members to contribute individually instead of directly from the Clubs bank accounts or maybe even both? You know, maybe the Club could equal whatever members contribute to make it a worthwhile donation. Whatever is decided, I agree it is a worthy cause and we should support the local community.*

Well there are some of the Committee's ideas – what about you, the members telling us what you think. In the meantime, I will write letters to SuperCheap, Autobarn and Bunnings and ask them for GIFT VOUCHERS for our raffles, specifically for Beau.

Enough of non-vehicle related matters – do hope all you mothers in CHACC have/had a wonderful Mothers Day.

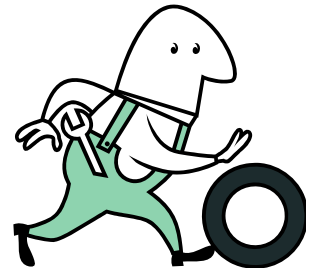
