


Proves we have people in the Club who are willing to put down everything they are doing to help one another out - and we think that is tremendous.

Some interesting facts & information......from Mal Melville

"Caboolture" is derived from Kabi words meaning "Place of the Carpet Snake". The Kabi people harvested bush food, fresh water mussels, oysters, fish and some game animals, moving around the land to take best advantage of seasonally available produce.

"Burpengary" comes from Burpen-gar, meaning the place of the green wattle tree. This tree, sometimes also called the early black wattle, grows in open forest country.

"Dakabin" comes from the Yugarabul Aboriginal language meaning grass tree or grass root.

The Jagera and Turrbal groups occupied land in the Brisbane and Ipswich areas. The exact clan boundaries are not known, however, the Turrbal people generally occupied the area north of the Brisbane River. Both groups had closely related languages that are classified as belonging to the larger Yaggera language group.



Tom Petrie, an early settler, indicated that the Turrbal language was spoken as far north as North Pine, west to Moggil and Gold Creek, and south to the Logan. He built a homestead he named "Murrumba" meaning good.

"Carseldine" was named after fencing contractor William Carseldine who settled in Bald Hills in 1858. He went there to work for John Stewart, who had settled on the site now occupied by St Paul's school. The family name is usually spelt Castledean. William was illiterate and his son John spelt the name as best he could; hence the variation. The Carseldine family made important contributions to the community. His son, James, established the first store in Bald Hills in 1869 which acted as the post office and later a newsagency. John was instrumental in establishing the track which later became Gympie Road.

In November 1860, Henry St John Bridgeman bought land bounded by Albany Creek, Albany Creek Road, Bridgeman Road and Beams Road. Important families in the region included the Beckett family, who lived in Beckett Road until 1914.

Keperra is believed to be an Aboriginal name. Some sources say that it is derived from the word "Kipper" which is an Indigenous word given to a youth who has the reached the age of initiation.

"Enoggera" is derived from the word Yowoggera which means corroboree.



Current SIVS guidelines:

The SIVS registered vehicle operator agrees to restrict the use of the SIVS registered vehicle to:

- (a) Participating in rallies/runs organised by incorporated car (vehicle) clubs.
- (b) Participating in processions for which a Special Event permit has been issued under the Transport Operations (Road Use Management) Regulation 1995.
- (c) Exhibiting the vehicle in displays, fetes or similar functions conducted for religious, charitable or educational purposes.
- (d) Use for ceremonial purposes involving immediate family members, for example weddings or school formals (immediate family means spouse, parents, siblings, grandparents or carers and children and grandchildren. It generally does not refer to extended family relationships such as nephews and nieces), provided this is not done for a fee or reward.
- (e) Preparing for, proceeding to, and returning from the above activities.
- (f) Vehicles are not permitted to carry commercial loads.
- (g) Road testing within a 15 kilometre radius from the place where the vehicle is garaged after restoration or repair.
- (h) Travel in order to have the vehicle repaired; there is no distance restriction in these circumstances. However such travel must be reasonable and openly justified by the vehicle driver.


