Hates Darren's long lunches at the Woodpecker!



Here is your opportunity to purchase a vehicle that lead a hugely popular GM icon, **this vehicle is from the very first year of Pontiac – Chief of the Sixes.**

This car was fully restored by my father and I approximately 30 years ago and unfortunately due to dad's ill health & subsequent death and my lack of knowledge, this glorious Vintage vehicle is now up for sale.

According to all of the individual Australian State Dept of Transports, there are only 6 registered 1926 Pontiacs in Australia, 2 being Sedans, 2 or 4 door ?.

This is truly a rare vehicle



Below are just some of the restoration points and features of this vehicle:

- This vehicle has been fully stripped to bare chassis and carefully rebuilt back up to original specs.
- Dad, as a qualified Motor Mechanic, has fully rebuilt the Motor, Gearbox & Diff "in the old ways".
- All of the trim work has been replaced by an "old style trimmer" to the original colour, fabric style and comfort as found in the vehicle when stripped down.
- All of the timber has been inspected, the front LHS chassis rail was replaced.
- As Dad was also a qualified vehicle spray painter, it was repainted using only the highest quality paint & still today raises a shine with a small amount of hand polish. The photos show this car only "washed" and still has a good shine.
