Recipe **Ginger Scones**

3 Cups SR flour 1 tbsp Icing Sugar Pinch salt ½ Cup Cream 1 to 1½ Cups Ginger Beer (room temperature)

Heat oven to 220c

Sift dry ingredients. Add the salt, cream and Ginger Beer Using a knife mix the cream and ginger beer gently though the dry ingredients. Work quickly into dough on a floured board. Flatten to 3-4cms high Use a scone cutter to cut scones. Place close together on a greased and floured scone tray

Then brush with milk.

Bake on top shelf of oven for 10 to 12 minutes.




