
vehicle) for us to have a look at. It was a very inconspicuous car but in that era it got results. The owner also showed some interest in joining the club.






Welcome Wall Ceremony @ Darling Harbour for Immigrants



2 cups plain flour 2 tbs rice flour 1/2 cups caster sugar 250 gms butter

Sift flours into a large bowl. Add sugar and rub in butter. Roll mixture on a floured surface to 1.5 cm thickness. Cut into desired shapes. Place on baking tray and bake at 160C for 25 minutes.
