

A variant was licensed and built by Packard and fitted to the North American P-51 Mustang Fighter. Both planes played pivotal roles in the ultimate destruction of the Luftwaffe (German Air force).

Did You Know?

Buggies and sulky had springs and mudguards like cars today, and many had hoods like convertible cars. Car bodies were made of native timbers such as Kauri, Silky Oak or Hoop Pine. Wheels were often made of American Hickory, but Spotted Gum and Ironbark were also used.

Recipe Caramel Fudge

125 g butter
395 g sweetened condensed milk
2 tbs golden syrup
1 cup brown sugar
3/4 cup white chocolate chopped into pieces small



Line a 7 cm x 25 cm bar tin with baking paper.

STEP 2: Melt butter in a medium saucepan over a low heat. Add condensed milk, golden syrup and brown sugar.

STEP 3: Stir over a low heat until it comes to the boil, then simmer for 10 minutes, stirring constantly.

STEP 4: Remove from heat, stir in white chocolate and mix until smooth.

STEP 5: Pour into prepared tin and allow to cool. Refrigerate for at least two hours. Serve cut into squares or slices.
