The RACQ has led the charge for sensible road safety initiatives in recent times and is offering motorists a chance to put their views forward with an on-line survey accessible from their web site at [www.racq.com.au](http://www.racq.com.au) and follow the links to the survey. It only takes a few minutes and no names are required and you do not have to be a member (although why aren't you?). Say what you really feel and at least give someone who cares an idea of the problems that are out there. I feel that the government really needs to make this summit a success as they are being hammered out there in the real world because of health, education and police (which is part of the reason the road toll is high anyway). These politicians and beaurocrats need to hear us loud and clear, as it's the only time they realise that we are out there struggling with the result of their penny pinching policies and short cut solutions that don't work.
