Rally Report - July run to Virgin Blue Pilot Training Facility

What a magnificent job by Ron and Brenda Byrnes in getting us a tour of the high security Virgin Blue pilot training facility. We had a massive turnout of members arrive all keen to take a look. There must've been over 1000 of us! Well, actually about 100, but that's much more than we usually get. This place trains commercial passenger jet pilots 25 hours a day, 390 days a year. They have five of these giant playstations (as pictured) all fitted out just like the actual cockpits and mounted on hydraulic rams to make the tilt just like the real thing. These machines are so



realistic to fly that the training pilots actually log their hours in them as real flying time. An instructor can sit behind the pilots and simulate any weather condition and mechanical fault. This allows them to experience the extreme while staying firmly attached to the ground. Worth around 5 million each, these are toys most of us will only see once in a lifetime. While we were there, the Virgin Blue PR guy took photos of the cars in front of their sign and asked us a few questions about CHACC so they can do an article of our visit in their magazine.

Since we had such a massive turnout, we had to take the tour in batches of around 20 people. Though, nobody minded waiting as Ron and Brenda and their lovely daughters had organised a scrumptious morning tea of jam and cream scones and tea/coffee for everyone.
