Extracts from March 26th General Meeting Minutes General Business:

- (1) By law 1 Proposed Change. The Motion to amend by-law 1 to read "There is no limit as to how many years a delegate may serve as a member of the Management Committee, save that no delegate shall hold the same committee position for more than FOUR (4) years in a row" (2yrs changed to 4yrs) was formally moved by John Greene (Mustang Owners Cub) and seconded by Val Sharp (Cadillac). There was some discussion about the change however there was overwhelming support and the motion was carried
- (2) NMHD: The attempts to reduce our hobbies' carbon footprint by working with the developer, BMD, to have QCCHVC (QHMC) involved in tree planting has not progressed. The Combined Council president will be placing advertisements for NMHD events shortly. All clubs are asked again to inform the secretary if they are planning an event for 17th May so that Combined Council can advertise it in the press and motoring magazines.
- (3) Combined Council Rally: The entry numbers for this years Combined Council rally are down considerably on previous years.
- (4) Calendar of Events: Date Claimer Event Calendar. Affiliated clubs are asked to only advertise swaps and events that are listed on the CC Calendar of Events. Clubs are reminded to get their date claims in either to the secretary or Tom Lewis ASAP - it is first in best dressed, to claim dates on the Combined Council calendar. The meeting discussed that while Combined Council has no power to prevent clubs running competing events on the same day we encourage clubs to try to hold events on dates other than those that are already on the CC calendar. CC will list and advertise multiple events on the event calendar, on the same day, provided the club who requested the date first agree to have the second event listed.
- (5) QHMC RALLY 2010: The committee will contact the Bundaberg club to find out what if any assistance they need to organise the 2010 Rally.
- (6) QHMC AGM The QHMC's AGM for 2008/9 will be held at the conclusion of the September monthly general meeting at the above address. Nomination forms will be posted out with the March meeting
- (7) Dating Certificate. The President, David James, indicated that he was not happy the proposed dating certificate that was recommended for use as the standard dating certificate and distributed to all clubs with a request that each club be in a position to vote at its adoption or rejection at the March meeting. David announced that he was not proposing to ask clubs to vote on the previously proposed dating certificate. David indicated that the Council should restart the process of developing a more concise dating certificate and asked delegates for input on what was required on the form. There was discussion on what items should be included and if the form should be one or two pages. The meeting made no decisions or formal recommendation on what was to be included, excluded or recommended, several delegates had contrary views. Some clubs indicated that they had already adopted the form which the committee recommended in January. David advised that a new proposed dating certificate will be developed by the management committee taking on board all comments and input. The new proposed new Dating Certificate will be distributed with these minutes to be voted on at the May general meeting. Clubs are urged to adopt the proposed form.

NOTE - Kim will distribute the proposed Draft of the new dating certificate to Rob Blake, Don Streeton, Ronnie Walters & Bob Pritchard for their comments and input before the next CC meeting.


Robyn: The weirdest food I ever ate was baby octopus. My favourite food is anything Italian and I love tomato pasta.


