

Mid week Run Report 11th May 2011

This morning's run had been organised by Jan and Graham Beatson, who provided an easy to follow run sheet, and a suitably difficult (for us) set of automobile trivia questions. The destination was the Taoist Temple, just off the Gateway motorway, and I'm sure many of us have passed the sign and wondered what this place was. Well, wonder no more!

The Ching Chung Taoist Temple sits next to the Gateway Arterial Road. It was built at Deagon in 1991. The Evergreen Temple is the largest Taoist Temple in the Southern Hemisphere. It also included an Aged Care facility open to all denominations, and the occupants can be seen around the environs of the Temple – enjoying the serenity and lush green surroundings of the gardens.



Taoism is an ancient Chinese religion and philosophy. The writings of the Tao Te Ching promote natural harmony with nature. These writings are considered to be influenced by Buddhist ideals, Confucian philosophy and traditional ancient Chinese mysticism.

Taoism has greatly influenced the arts of China, which is evident in the sprawling complex full of colour, statues and ornate trimmings. We were warmly welcomed through huge wooden doors into serenely beautiful courtyards by our gracious host, Sister Linda Yuen, who proved to be a knowledgeable and interesting guide.

There are three Halls which were built according to Taoist beliefs The Hall of Three Purities, the Hall of Three Masters and the Hall of the Spiritual Garden. There is also a Memorial Hall of Ancestors

As Confucius says "A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step," and we began our journey under the guidance of Sister Linda who went to great lengths to explain the beliefs and reasoning behind the statues, and the different types of offerings placed before them.

The path to our enlightenment of the Taoist beliefs was smoothed by the patient and concise descriptions of the Gods and their attendants, as retold by Sister Linda, in a most fascinating and logical manner.

At the end of our tour, all agreed that it was certainly a very educational and enjoyable experience.

Also included for the first time in our tour group was an in-patient from Cooinda House (Greg) and his carer Cara. Cara had contacted the club because Greg had expressed an interest in classic cars – he was a panelbeater/spray painter – and she thought a run with some enthusiasts would help his rehabilitation. As it turned out, he enjoyed it immensely, and was able to relate to our members during his time with us, so much so that when he returned he asked Cara when our next run would be!

Special thanks must go to Kim & Carol for collecting Greg and Cara from Cooinda, and to Hudson and Ita for taking them back.

By the way, your now enlightened correspondent was the lucky winner of the trivia quiz, and took possession of an extremely ingenious and well made metal model of a 3 wheel motorbike – which is much appreciated. Thanks again for a well run outing to Jan & Graham.


