

Queensland Historic Motoring Council Inc. General Meeting Thursday 22 Jan 2013

(Extract from QHMC minutes)

Seat Belts:

Just confirming that it is understood that the seat belt issue still has to pass through the legal process. The State Minister for Transport and Main Roads, Mr Scott Emerson, has written to QHMC and advised that after reviewing the existing legislation, he has asked his department to progress an amendment to QRR to reflect national model legislation (ARR).

Should the legislative change be agreed to by government, children from age seven will be permitted to travel in vehicles where no seatbelts are fitted and there is no requirement to do so (QRR section 267(1B) applies). All Clubs please note that any legislative changes will be subject to normal government approval process, therefore, a specific commencement date cannot be provided at this stage.

Doris the Morris History



Doris started her on road life when she was purchased by a lady in Nudgee from Howard Limited of 327 Adelaide Street, Brisbane on the 9th August 1965. Her pedigree is that her body number is YMGS130072, Engine number 10Y/TA/H/30506 and her colour is Dream Blue.

She was acquired in late 2004 by a couple of young fellows as part of the purchase of the owners' house at Nudgee that they intended to renovate and resell. The car was unregistered at the time and was reregistered by one of the guys and to be used by his dad as a cheap runabout.

Sometime between it being reregistered and when I purchased Doris from the young fellow on the 3rd of December 2007, she had had a bad case of fluid suspension dissipation and she was sitting very low to the ground. She also had no brakes and the exhaust was shot. The body work and interior was pretty good for her age. The brakes and exhaust were not a major problem to repair but I was concerned about the suspension. The battery was charged and the engine fired up quite easily and ran smoothly. To check on possible problems I might encounter with the suspension, I had rung our ex pres Bill Randell (an old hand at BMC/Nuffield cars) and with further inspection there was no sign of fluid leaks and it was thought the fluid had more than likely evaporated and new fluid would probably restore the suspension. This was found to be a correct diagnosis!

Getting her home and into the 'delug' to do the repairs was a bit of a drama. I had hired a car trailer and because of the lowered suspension and the short ramps you are supplied with when you hire the trailer, we had trouble clearing the exhaust pipe and muffler. With the help of the two guys and another chap and some longer planks and bricks, we eventually got her



over the rear edge and settled onto the trailer for the run home from Bardon where the two guys had purchased another house to renovate. She had been stored under cover for most of her life so the paint work was pretty good.

Getting her off at home was not a problem as I could back the trailer into the gutter. a I have a steepish driveway and she came off easily and I reversed her into the 'delug' easily. At least I now knew that 1st and reverse worked.

Working on her when time permitted, the brake and clutch reservoir/master cylinders were rebuilt, new rear brake line fitted, new exhaust manufactured and fitted (had to take up the old pipes to be used as a template), replaced a universal joint on the right hand drive shaft, then found out the U bolt end hit the exhaust pipe because the engine pipe was rebuilt with a one size larger diameter so a modification fixed the problem. (I have since had the exhaust system rebuilt with the correct piping.) Whilst waiting for some of this work to be done by others, the engine bay got a bit of a clean and repaint and she was given an oil change and grease and new plugs and points and a tune up.

After a few minor items to be attended to (a compliance plate to cover the seat belts that had been installed not long after the initial purchase), we eventually got her registered on 19th May 2008 and have been happily attending club runs since.

Just prior to Christmas, I removed the radiator to have it cleaned out and tested and whilst doing so the bonnet was sanded back and repainted (thanks Bob), the radiator shroud repainted and the rocker cover repainted and new gasket fitted.

To date, she has travelled 80652 miles.

Future items to repair or upgrade are the traffic indicator control and respringing of the front seat when money permits.



<u>Recipe</u>

Weet-bix Slice

3 Weet-bix crushed 34 cup brown sugar 1 cup coconut 1 cup SR flour Vanilla essence 125g malted butter



Place crushed Weet-bix into a bowl, add all dry ingredients and stir. Pour over melted butter. Mix well, press into a slice tray and bake for 20 minutes at 180°C. Leave in tin and ice while hot and cut when cold.

<u>Icing</u>

Icing sugar, coco or cochineal, small amount of water. Mix well. Spread over hot slice. Sprinkle with coconut, crushed nuts or sprinkles.
