Did You Know?



Every year we hope that our road toll is less than the previous year. Have you ever wondered, who was the first person ever to be killed as a result of a car accident?

Well the first person world-wide who died as a result of being hit by a car (not in a car crash) was Mrs Bridget Driscoll, a 44 year old pedestrian of Croydon, Surrey. As she and her daughter May crossed the road on the grounds of the Crystal Palace on 17 August 1896, a car being driven by Arthur James Edsall of Upper Norwood approached. According to witnesses, the car hit Mrs Driscoll "at tremendous speed", about 6 kilometres per hour.

The inquest into Mrs Driscoll's death lasted for about 6 hours, after which the jury returned a verdict of "accidental death". No prosecution was made. It is rather ironic that the coroner at the inquest, Percy Morrison, stated, "This must never happen again."

1912 T Ford

Restoring Margret.....

Our 1912 T Ford Mother-In-Law After playing with old vehicles for many years and T Fords for the last 10, we were looking for a Brass veteran and found a lot of what we needed in Toowoomba. The price was a bit stiff but we got most of what we needed.



Two tandem loads later, we had a collection of mostly veteran parts.

On stripping down to the chassis, we had to change the rear cross member to the correct year (supplied by a helpful I.T. owner) and made the rear body supports, which were missing. Stripped and re-sleeved the engine, shaft ground and white mettaling done, aluminium pistons were fitted, camshaft ground with adjustable cam followers and new valves with oversize stems fitted.

Magneto re magnetised and coils tested. Gear box was okay to use, relined the bands with Kevlar, not silk as originally fitted. The veteran sump was twisted and we had to make a jig to solve this one as the rear white metal bearing in the back of the gearbox is the 4th main and will break the crankshaft is not lined up. Fitted an extra outside oil

line to the front of the motor to feed the front bearings on long hills. Rebuilt all 4 coils and tested. An old aftermarket water pump was rebushed and new sealing material fitted (no water pump was fitted originally). All the bolt holes in the sump were stretched and had to be peened down to get good seal.

Next the diff — wrong year! Luckily, in the collection of parts was the correct one that had been converted for trailer use, so a strip and rebuild with loose bits found in the shed solved the problem. Rear spring pack incorrect but once again the junk in the shed supplied, the leaves do not line up but only a new spring pack will fix that.

New firewall from the USA and the radiator is full of leaves, grass and paper. Steering column does not match the shaft and will interfere with the tie rod, shortened the shaft and cut a new spline. Fitted new kingpins and tie rod ends. Ground the 3 ball joint caps to a snug fit (these have no lubrication).

Found a set of rocky mountain brakes in NSW T Ford club magazine (after market for







Ts) and had to make up the linkage as that was missing. The body was in good condition. Stripped all the paint and replaced the rear seat support and painted twice (Valmay can pick a paint run at 100 metres). The mother-in-law seat is a tub chair cut down with timber inserts fitted.

The side lights were found while on a rally in Winsor NSW – 1913, wrong year! Bugger! however the best we could get and an excellent

price. The carbide pot was a trade for a 1926T block and the tyre pump off eBay. New front floor mat found in Lismore, NSW.

We got 4 new tyres with purchase and the brass headlamps, but required burners and reflectors – the tail light came off eBay. Glass for the windscreen and headlights from Vintage Auto Glass, a T Ford club member. We then only needed to fit an aftermarket damper to the steering and the mother-in-law is finished, (if projects like this are ever finished).

The upholstery was done by Nick from Outrage Motor Trimmers, Narangba. This has taken 4 years with the help of friends, traded parts, eBay and Snyder's Antique Auto USA.

All mistakes are mine, and the corrections are by Valmay.



HOW TO FIND YMCA OLD PETRIE TOWN

From the North: Take the Kallangur / Petrie exit (Anzac Avenue) and follow the road to Petrie.

Turn right at the roundabout into Dayboro Road.

Continue on Dayboro Road, past the Youngs Crossing Road intersection (lights) Approx 200m turn left into Old Petrie Town (North Pine Country Park).

From the South: Take the Strathpine exit off the Bruce highway.

After passing the Westfield Shopping Centre turn left into Samsonvale Road.

Follow this road until you traffic lights then turn into Youngs crossing road. Follow this road until you come to a "T" intersection, turn left at Dayboro Road

Approx 200m turn left into Old Petrie Town (North Pine Country Park).

From The Gateway Arterial Road: Take the Dohles Rocks Road exit - just past the Pine River - Follow this road until you come to Anzac Avenue.

Turn left into Anzac Avenue. Continue to a 3 way roundabout at Petrie.

Turn right at the roundabout into Dayboro Road.

Continue on Dayboro Road, past the Youngs Crossing Road intersection (lights) Approx 200m turn left into Old Petrie Town (North Pine Country Park).

From the West: Travel to South Pine Road, turn left at Eatons Crossing Road. Turn right at Lilley Road, continue to Samsonvale Road roundabout and turn right. Follow this road until you reach a large roundabout at Warner and turn left into Young's Crossing Road.

Follow this road until you come to a "T" intersection, turn left at Dayboro Road Approx 200m turn left into Old Petrie Town (North Pine Country Park).



Recipe

Mini coconut cupcakes

100g butter, softened
1/3 cup caster sugar
1/2 teaspoon coconut essence
1 egg
3/4 cup self-raising flour
1/3 cup desiccated coconut
1/4 cup milk
1 tablespoon white sugar
Pink food coloring



Icing

60g unsalted butter, softened 1 cup icing sugar mixture 1 tablespoon milk

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease 18 holes of two 12-hole mini muffin pans.

Using an electric mixer, beat butter, caster sugar and coconut essence in a bowl until pale and creamy. Add egg and beat to combine. Combine flour and coconut in a bowl. Stir into butter mixture alternately with the milk. Mix until just combined. Divide mixture between muffin holes. Bake for 12 to 15 minutes or until golden brown and a skewer inserted into one cake comes out clean. Stand cakes in pan for 5 minutes before turning out onto a wire rack to cool.

Make icing: Using an electric mixer, beat butter, icing sugar and milk in a bowl until light and fluffy. Spread over cake tops.

Place white sugar and 1 to 2 drops of food coloring into a small plastic bag. Rub bag between hands until sugar turns pink. Sprinkle sugar mixture over cakes.
