Firstly let me give you a couple of bits of good news – The first is that I am still here standing in front of you, and not at the Sheraton Mirage in Port Douglas enjoying the sort of break only \$15,000 of other people's money can get you.

Secondly, our books have been audited by our Honorary Auditor who said, and I quote "The financial statements of the Club for the 12 months ended 31st August 2013 present fairly in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards and other mandatory professional reporting requirements (Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views) the financial position of the Club as at 31st August 2013 and the results of its operations for the year then ended. So, no one in CHACC is a crook!

And all those other members who continue to support us by renewing their memberships each year, and who, for one reason or another are unable to attend our regular monthly or mid-week runs.

To all of you I sincerely thank you and may we see you all as often as you can make it - you will always be made welcome for that is the kind of people who make up this club. Thank you.

Did You Know?



Ford is claimed to be the first company to produce an Australian "ute". This was the result of a letter from the wife of a Victoria farmer in 1932 asking for "a vehicle to go to church in on a Sunday and the pigs to market on Mondays". In response, Ford designer Lew Bandt developed the ute and the model (called a "coupe utility" at the time) was released in 1934. A convertible version, known as the roadster Utility

was produced in limited numbers by Ford in the 1930s. However, both closed and open pickups had been produced for at least 10 years before that in America by Ford, Chevrolet, and Dodge and the Australian ute followed in the same pattern.



Recipe

Christmas Cake

4 cups sultanas

1 teaspoon vanilla

1 teaspoon lemon rind

1 teaspoon orange rind

1 teaspoon orange rind

1 teaspoon orange rind

1 cup brown sugar

175g mixed peel 4 eggs

1/4 cup dates
1 2/3 cups plain flour
1 cup nuts
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 cup sherry
1 cup butter
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 cup extra sherry



Chop raisins, dates, nuts and cherries. Combine all fruit and nuts in a large bowl or jar. Add sherry, let stand for as long as possible a day or two, The longer the better. Stir every now and than.

Line the sides and bottom of a round or square cake tin with 4-5 sheets of grease proof paper.

Beat butter, vanilla and rinds until smooth. Add brown sugar; beat in eggs, one at a time until combined. Add fruit, mix well. Add sifted dry ingredients, mix well. Pour into lined cake tin. Bake at 150°C for 3 hour, or until cooked. Remove from oven. Pour extra sherry over cake, cover with foil, and leave cake in tin until cold.

This is a dark and moist Christmas cake. Please do dot use mixed fruit as it will alter the flavour of the cake
