





Recipe

Spinach Pie

1 bunch English spinach
¼ cup olive oil
1 onion chopped
6 green onions chopped
125g feta cheese
¼ cup grated mozzarella
¼ grated parmesan
1 tablespoon mixed herbs
¼ teaspoon nutmeg
4 eggs
90g butter
10 sheets filo pastry



Wash spinach place in saucepan without water. Cook until wilted. Drain well. Heat oil, sauté onion. Place onions, spinach, cheese, herds and nutmeg in mixing bowl, combine well. Stir in eggs. Line a pie dish with pastry. Pour filling into pastry. Top with pastry. Bake 180°C for 30 to 35 minutes.

AMERICAN DREAM ROUTE 66 CRUZERS-NEWSLETTER - #1 - Route 66 Journey



Hi everyone, this is the overview of our journey along Route 66 and will be outlined over 4 newsletter briefs to allow you better knowledge of places and people you may encounter along the way.

When you arrive in Chicago our hotel is located close to Ohare International Airport as well as the care hire outlets. We are out of town, by some 19 miles or so and if you want to see Chicago downtown in more detail, we recommend that individuals wishing to do so, arrive before the tour date commences. This gives you an opportunity to enjoy staying in a city location or arrange day tours from a closer hotel, than Radisson Ohare. In Chicago its breezy most seasons and extra clothing to safeguard you is a good idea. Tourist sites in the city are based on entry fees with some free locations. Parking costs are extreme if you use your own vehicle and a maxi taxi for a few people usually works better.

From the Willis Tower formerly known as Sears Tower you can see most of what surrounds you and has special external glass platforms that you can walk on for photos, that can be spectacular. The lake area shines as well as the Fountain in the Grant Park precinct. Navy Pier is worth a stroll or Bus Ride dependant on your location.

The start of Route 66 is on the Corner of Jackson and Lake Shore Blvd. The route is not well marked, so don't blink as you pass. Several roadworks throughout the downtown precinct will try your patience, so stay cool and don't stress. Traffic lights will break up the group and there is nothing we can do to prevent this, so catch up using the GPS Route 66 programme, phone or radio.

After leaving Chicago we head for the sprawling suburbia on a south westerly direction to the Joliet area. Using Ogden Street you start to see the old diners and car washes around Cicero, that would have been busy in the days when this was a major thoroughfare. It is still a busy road today! At Henrys Drive- in diner you can still see the Neon of a giant Hot Dog that invites you to come on in.

On our way to Joliet we see the White Fence Farm that sells Chicken, The man ranch (prison), several old disused servos / diners before we cross the Des Plaines river into historic Joilet proper. In Joliet we stop at Route 66 museum and welcome centre, Art

deco Rialto Square theatre, walk the streets to find some character coffee outlets. Leaving Joliet we head for the Chicagoland Speedway and Route 66 Raceway when active drag racing still happens today. We may get to see inside the track if permission is given.

Once leaving here highway speeds help us along to Willmington, where we stop at one of the giants found along 66, known as the Gemini Giant statue alongside the 66 diner which is worth a pic or three. Leaving the giant we head for Gardner where an old street car (tram) was used as a diner with the main building The Riviera being a former Speakeasy in the prohibition days.

After Gardner and a little further down the road we come across the little spot of Dwight that has various old relics and diners from the former era. The classic Amblers Texaco gas station is manned by volunteers as a tourist stop and serves as reminder of simpler times.

Odell looms up in a short drive with more to see such as the 1932 Standard Gas Station, as well as the only underground access tunnel on US66, built to allow children access to the church on the western side of 66 from their school on the eastern side. There is also a petrol pump exhibit in a private home garage on Route66, where we will stop to say g'day to the owners.

After Odell we finally arrive to see our friends in Pontiac (the jewel in the crown). This town has wall murals galore, museums, cars and friendly people that makes this stop a place to remember. They always want us to stay overnight here and mayor Bob has his welcome mat ready to display their great hospitality. At this early stage of your journey you have already seen more than most Americans, as their ability to leave their own county is not always realised.

Heading south for the township of Lincoln they have created a monument to their former leader by way of building a giant timber wagon that symbolises the horse drawn era of the time. We detour for a quick town tour and return to southbound 66.

At Williamsville we will try to see a vast collection of older cars known as the Dream Car Museum on Oak St., before going down to Die Cast Auto Sales on 117 North Elm St. The end of the action packed day is approaching so we travel through Sherman using BL55 on Peoria Rd before setting the GPS to our motel destination.

The overnight stop at Springfield IL is special with the State Fair Grounds being close by where there is another Route 66 giant located in the forecourt. We also recommend that you take the time to visit the Sheas Historic Route 66 site that is close by. This is a petroleum themed site and talk to the owner to get the feel of the era, as they were on the pointy end of the traffic flow known as the Mother Road.

All of these towns, points of interest will make more sense to you when you check out some of the photos.
