Mid-Week Run Wednesday 15th October 2014

Deception Bay foreshore

What was the first car to come equipped with anti-lock brakes?

Answer: The first car to include anti-lock brakes was the **1966 Jensen FF** which came equipped with the Dunlop Maxaret anti-lock braking system (originally developed for use on aircraft). Although crude by today's standards (and sometimes unreliable), the Jensen FF's anti-skid system was a huge technological breakthrough at the time. Three years later, in 1969, the Lincoln Continental Mark III improved on the idea, placing sensors on the rear wheels that modulated pressure on the rear brakes when they began to lock up.

Did You Know?

That several studies have been carried out on 'new car smells', and a large number of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) have been detected during this research. The estimated number of compounds varies wildly: several studies quote in the region of 50-60 volatile organic compounds. But where do these compounds come from? The majority of the compounds originate from the various parts of the new car. Chemicals used to make carpets, upholstery, plastics and adhesives used in the car can all contribute to the VOCs present via a process known as "off-gassing," by which they release fumes into the atmosphere. Studies are conflicting as to whether these compounds are harmful to human health at the levels present... however, the worst noted effects are headaches, drowsiness and mild allergic responses—and these can be minimized by ensuring adequate ventilation in very new cars



Recipe Lemonade Syrup

Peel from lemons before juicing 2 cups Lemon juice 1.5 cups sugar 2 cups water

Peel a strip off each lemon before juicing, Place in saucepan along water and sugar. Boil gently for 10minutes Remove from stove and allow to cool. Once cool remove the peel and then add the lemon juice. Bottle.

Pour some lemonade syrup over ice then fill your glass with soda water or water. Very refreshing summer drink.
