SEQUEL TO PHOTO FIND AUGUST 19th Run From Lew & Pat Vincent

The story behind this photo is quite a simple one, although the odds of seeing the photo in the Heritage Park Display was probably a million to one chance. The image is thought to have been taken in the summer of 1943. It was wartime and our men enlisted in the war effort overseas. American warships frequented Brisbane on shore leave. Brisbane, being a friendly country type town (back then), was well received by the Americans. General Douglas McArthur was also based in the town centre at the corner of Edward & Queen Streets. When a warship berthed in Brisbane, the sailors would disembark and march in formation down Queen St and turn into George St. Here the men would break ranks and merge with the excited crowds (mainly women) exchanging greetings, autographs etc.

Dances and other entertainment were organised, with inner city churches opening their doors seven days a week to provide a meeting place with food and drinks. Among the hosts were my Aunts (sisters Muriel Stocks, facing the camera, born in 1923 (now deceased) and Thelma Stocks, partly seen on the extreme left of the photo. She was born in 1925, still living aged 90 years. Thelma recalls the happy welcoming occasions when the ships came in.

On a darker side, the "Battle of Brisbane" took place down the end of Adelaide Street, where overzealous servicemen and local Brisbane men exchanged fisticuffs over their women folk. The brawl broke out onto the street where it took some time for the local constabulary to bring proceedings under control. Our thanks to Cassie Eivers (Trade Coast Central's project manager) for obtaining the photo from their archives and forwarding on an electronic copy.

Recipe New Zealand Lollie Cake

100g butter


1 tin condensed milk

- 2 packet Malt biscuits crushed, but with some larger pieces left in.
- 2 packet hard marshmallows ("Eskimo's", Fruit puffs,) cut into thirds or quarters.
- 5 Colored musk sticks
- 1 Cup desiccated coconut for coating the outside.

Melt the butter in a saucepan over a very low heat so it doesn't burn. Add the condensed milk to the melted butter, still over a very low heat, and stir the two together until the butter completely disappears.



(Don't be tempted to use high temp, it will scorch on the bottom of the pan very quickly) set aside to cool. Chop the hard marshmallows into thirds or quarters and put into a large baking bowl. Crush the Malt biscuits into fine crumbs with just a few bigger pieces. Mix the Malt biscuits in with the chopped hard marshmallows. Add condensed milk mix to the biscuit and marshmallow, using clean hands to squish it all together. Squeeze it together firmly, molding it into a log shape. Roll it gently in the coconut to cover the outside and ends. Wrap log plastic wrap and refrigerate until firm (overnight is even better) then cut into slices.
