Treasurer's Report

Well, here we are after another hectic year, and although the stock markets went haywire, we still survived.

We started the year (September 2014) with \$1,283.11 in our working (everyday) account and finished up 1 year later with \$1563.54. So we are \$280 dollars better off than 2013! But it's not all sweetness and light. We did need to draw on our investment account for some funds, with the result that it is a little bit lower. Specifically, we went from \$14,910.10 to \$14,329.48, meaning we fell behind by some 582 dollars and change. But if we offset that against our everyday profit, we are only down by just over \$300.

Now before all the hands go up asking ...why? I will explain. Firstly we subsidised a few outings for you – we got you into the Tramways museum at no cost to you, we gave you \$15 each to spend as you wished (Booze or food) at our Xmas function. Then we put \$5 in your pocket at the Beerwah Pub, and another \$5 each to those who braved the drive to the Pitstop Café on top of Mt Mee. And finally we put on a nice BBQ at Bunyaville where we combined with the BNAAA members. To put it in context, every member who came on a run got back a little over 40 bucks in subsidies, and if that's not a good reason to roll up for our Sunday runs.....I dunno what is! More importantly, what did we do for the local charities?

You will recall that at last year we nominated the Northside Renal Unit as our charity for 2014/15, and prior to that it was the leukemia Foundation for 2013/14. Well, we finished up matching the Sergeant at Arms Fines and donations dollar for dollar and the leukemia foundation got \$500. Then for this year, we went direct to the Renal Unit and asked them what they needed, and Shirley Jeffray and Sally Byrne got together and came back with a plan. I'll let them tell you about it themselves. So, apart from having some great times on our runs, our attendees have benefitted from our subsidies, but more importantly, we have used some of our money to brighten the lives of those who are a little less fortunate than us, and that should make all of you here feel good!

So when people ask what does your car club do? You can answer they give us a good time and help local charities for people in the area who need some joy in their lives. And remember that, when Sally comes chasing you for money 'cos you didn't wear your badge, or parked incorrectly!!

President's Report December 2015

We will shortly be sitting down to a nice meal, in pleasant surroundings, with friends and acquaintances to reflect on the upcoming festive season. We went on a lot of runs, midweek (which I particularly like – late start) and our normal first Sunday efforts. We had a great time at the Sanford Historical Museum on Australia day where our newly acquired mammoth shelter came in very handy. A lot of people came by to talk about our cars, but I suspect they just wanted out of the sun!. I won't bore you with details of all our runs, suffice to say a big vote of thanks to all those who organized the runs – it's what your club is all about. Also a big thankyou to Neils and Eileen for their untiring work in putting together our monthly SCN. It's not an easy task, and if any of you can help with articles, stories about your vehicles, or reminiscing about the "good old days" I know Eileen would be happy to receive them- in whichever format you choose.

It would be remiss of me not to mention and thank our hard working secretary "family" of Kim & Carol bowers, who do a sterling job with minutes each meeting and notifications of important items. And certainly our erstwhile Sergeant at Arms the young (in spirit anyway) Sally Byrne who is considering retiring from her position at this AGM. We all hate to see her go and I would beg for 1 more year, as the tongue in cheek contribution to our charitable efforts you all make through Sally's good natured fines system (although I could never work out her system) helps people less well off. So thanks again Sally

We will be starting our AGM, and can I plead with those of you who have some time to spare to nominate for a position on the committee. Recipe

Irish stew

1.25kg lamb neck chops, trimmed
1/2 cup plain flour
3 brown onions, chopped
1kg potatoes, peeled, sliced
2 carrots, peeled, thinly sliced into rounds
2 tablespoons tomato paste
3 cups boiling water
3 beef stock cubes, crumbled
1 cup flat-leaf parsley leaves, chopped
¼ cup mint leaves, chopped, to serve



Cut chops in half. Place flour in a plastic bag and season with salt and pepper. Place chops in bag and shake well to coat. Transfer chops to a plate. Reserve flour. Preheat oven to 130°C. Place onions, potatoes and carrots in an ovenproof dish. Top with half the chops. Repeat layers with remaining onions, potatoes, carrots and chops. Whisk reserved flour, tomato paste and 2 tablespoons cold water in a large jug until well combined. Slowly add boiling water, whisking constantly. Add stock cubes and parsley. Stir to dissolve stock cubes. Pour flour mixture over chops. Cover and cook for 4 hours or until meat tender and sauce thickened. Sprinkle with mint and serve.

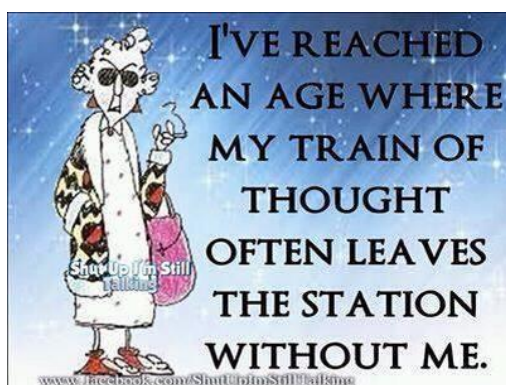
