QHMC Report:

- Ethanol mandated by Oueensland Government for the use of ethanol in all unleaded fuels to commence from mid-2016. The agreed figure is 3% rising to 4% in 2017. Unblended ULP may become unavailable at some outlets and the only option will be to use more expensive nonethanol premium fuel.
- Future club runs to not use the wording "rally". CTP insurers will not pay claims involving • DPC benefits (Driver Protection Cover) if the driver of the insured car is involved in any illegal activity such as a car rally. The words "car rally" are specific.

General Business:

- Grants availability. Inquiries made as to availability of grants and they are available from Commonwealth, State and Local Government bodies. No further action to be taken as there is no need for extra funds at this stage.
- July midmonth run is now being organised by Jenny and Stan Vallance •
- Big Buddy Project no action to be taken •
- Australia Zoo visit in conjunction with RACQ is not to proceed
- Web site discussion at committee meeting was addressed by Alex who contacted John Prichard who is looking into ways to reduce costs and a more "user friendly" website. Ongoing and further report to be received at next meeting
- Currently 40 members receive their SCN by Mail •

Recipe Golden Syrup Dumplings



tablespoon butter
 cup SR flour
 egg
 to 3 tablespoons milk

Rub butter into flour add egg and milk to make soft dough. Brake into balls, place into casserole dish

<u>Syrup</u>

1½ cup water
½ cup sugar
1½ tablespoon butter
1 tablespoon golden syrup
1 teaspoon lemon juice

Place all ingredients into saucepan, stir until sugar has dissolved and bring to boil. Pour over dumplings and bake at 190C for 20 - 30 minutes.
