- Treasurer's Report:** John Westerhuis detailed the income and expenses To end of July. Also balance in our Saver Account. Requested cheque for \$65 be issues in relation to our Anniversary dinner. Proposed John 2nd. Frank Tenney that they be accepted. Accepted.

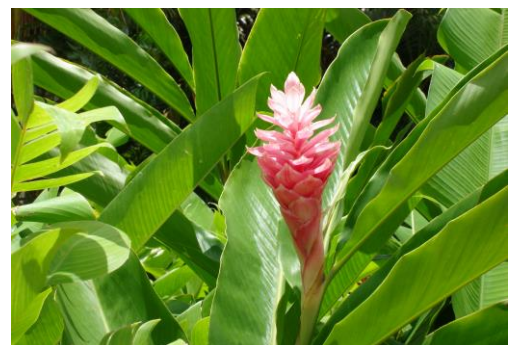


Classic & Historical Automobile Club of Caboolture Inc. Run Report Sunday 6th August

S.O.A. REPORT

As there has been no general meeting since the Run to Benarkin in June with the opportunity to raise funds, on the August I discussed with members as we did not have any S.O.A activity in July. I would ask members to consider a donation instead for the club's charity today, this was well received by the members & a TOTAL of **\$ 33.75** was donated, Thank you all for your great support.

A bit of history, I have had the opportunity in the past weeks to do some follow up with regards to the donation of goods that your club donated to the North Lakes Satellite Renal Unit, some years ago & I thought that I would take this opportunity to share this with you on what a difference it has made to the patients that are having dialysis.

The North Lakes Renal has **14** units for dialysis treatment does two [2] shifts a day and runs from Monday to Saturday – the days for an individual Patient can be Monday – Wednesday - Friday or Tuesday – Thursday - Saturday, an average time on dialysis can be **5** hours plus the time of going on & coming off the unit.

Prior to the clubs donation, what books the clinic had were stacked on window sills on the floor & everywhere else, now they have a book case with a good supply of books in constant use, as for patients I was told that **2** patients are blind & the readers the club supplied have made a big difference to their time on dialysis, just a few things that have made a difference in some people's lives.

That donation was a sizeable one “**BUT**” even a small donation can make a difference, especially when it was made direct to where it is needed, hopefully the club with **YOUR** help can continue each year to assist a worthwhile charity or situation.
