Recipe

NOI TUCKER'S TOM YUM SOUP

CHICKEN - BEEF - FISH - PRAWNS

500 gms chicken drumsticks/wings/thigh

2 litres water

1 teaspoon salt

1 fresh lemon grass stick

1-5 coriander roots

3-4 dried galangal slices (cock brand is best) or fresh slices

1 fresh big chili

4-5 Kafir lime leaves

75ml fish sauce (Three crabs brand)

¹/₄ cup chilli paste (best brand is Pantai Norasingh chili paste with soy bean oil)

100ml fresh lemon juice

100ml fresh milk

Fresh coriander for garnish

Green shallots for garnish

Extra chilli sliced thin for individual taste

METHOD; Put water in saucepan wit6h salt, lemon grass, coriander roots, galangal, chilli and kafir lime leaves. Bring water to the boil and cook on a low heat for 5 minutes.

Option 1: Add chicken or beef and bring to a boil again and cook on low heat for 15-20minutes or until tender. Add fish sauce, chilli paste, lemon juice (to your taste), and stir, then add milk, and stir and taste. You may add extra fish sauce/lemon juice if required.

Option 2: For seafood add 4 to 5 slices of fresh finger to broth in the beginning, add fish pieces/prawns and remove from heat & serve. Garnish with fresh herbs before serving.

Option 3: Pan fry prawns or fish – put in soup bowls and broth.
