This Month's Car Facts

Electric cars are not a new thing; they were already being manufactured in 1905. Rauch & Lang produced electric cars until 1920.

Mr. H.H. Bliss, a real estate man from New York, was the first victim of vehicular manslaughter in the United States. In September of 1899, he exited a trolley car and was hit by an electric taxicab. Though he was not killed instantly, he did not survive the injuries to his head and chest.

Ford executive stylist John Najjar is credited with naming the Mustang. Najjar was said to be a fan of the WWII P-51 Mustang fighter plane - the wild horse emblem originated later from marketing.

Apart from luxurious automobiles, Rolls-Royce is also noted for developing and building the Rolls-Royce Merlin engine during WWII. The 12-cylinder motor equipped many British warplanes including the Spitfire. A variant was licensed and built by Packard and fitted to the American P-51 Mustang Fighter.
