Mulberry Pie

3 cups mulberries
1 ½ cups white sugar
½ cup all-purpose flour
1 recipe pastry for a 9 inch double crust pie
2 tablespoons butter
1 tablespoon milk

Preheat oven to 200C

In a large bowl, mix berries with sugar and flour. Place mixture

into bottom of pie crust. Dot with butter and then cover top pastry (pie crust). Crimp edges, cut slits in upper crust, and brush with milk. Let pie rest in refrigerator for 30 minutes.

Bake pie for 15 minutes. Lower oven temperature to 175C and bake for an additional 30 minutes. Remove pie from oven and let sit on wire rack until cool.


