If you have never, been it's a great experience, heaps of laughs, fun and old Guys in old cars with up to 200 competitors in a 1Km sprint around the streets of Leyburn. You might even see Dick Johnson or John French. Sometimes there are V supercars taking part. It's a great drive if you go to via Gatton, Ma Ma Creek and Clifton to Leyburn..

## Secretary's Scribbles August 2021 (Continued)

With regards to Queensland Transport conditions where Special Interest Vehicles are participating in impromptu events, following is a summary of the CHACC Procedure. Changes are highlighted in red.

## CHACC POLICY STATEMENT FOR IMPROMPTU EVENTS (01/07/2021)

Queensland Transport and Main Roads Department has agreed to broaden the scope of the SIVS Registration scheme.

The Scheme does not permit any variation from the existing SIVS scheme in relation to entitlement to SIVS registration, hiring out of vehicles or the parameters for acceptable use of SIVS registered vehicles. i.e. It is not permissible to add Impromptu Events for driving to work or go shopping.

The maximum number of Impromptu Events allowable for each member per year will be 60 for each SIVS registered vehicle when combined with normal Club calendar of events.

As the Impromptu Event will generally be 1 day duration, it is asknowledged that certain

As the Impromptu Event will generally be 1 day duration, it is acknowledged that certain circumstances may necessitate extending this period within reason.

Prior to departure the individual member will be solely responsible for the Impromptu Event to be properly listed with the Club and they can access documentary evidence if required by Police or Transport Department officials.

The Members to check with their insurer in relation to extra usage for Impromptu Events. The Club executive have the discretionary power to deny access to Impromptu Events to any member who fails to follow agreed policy or becomes a non-financial member of the Club.

## PROCEEDURES FOR CHACC IMPROMPTU EVENTS FOR FINANCIAL MEMBERS

**Facebook Option:** Members Page is only for Listing Impromptu Events

- a. Log into your own personal Facebook page
- b. Go to the CHACC Facebook page
- c. At the top of the posts you will see CHACC IMPROMPTU EVENTS FOR MEMBERS
- d. Click the join button, a request will be sent for you to join.
- e. Once accepted into the group you will receive a notification on your Facebook page.
- f. After you have received notification you can post your Impromptu Events into CHACC IMPROMPTU EVENTS FOR MEMBERS page.

When posting you must remember to post the 4D's

- 1 Date MUST BE 24 HOURS prior to your impromptu run/event
- 2 Departure Time
- 3 Departing from
- 4 Destination & Invite other CHACC members to attend your event

## Non-Facebook Option: Text or E-mail

- Text or E-mail one of the designated Members who will list your Impromptu Event.
- Provide them your list of 4D's: Date, Departure time, Departing from, Destination
- Take a proof of your text or email with you on the Impromptu Event.

## Some Interesting Car Facts I Bet You Didn't Know

## Dubai police have the world's fastest police car

The Dubai Police Department's fleet of 14 supercars includes an <u>Audi R8</u> and Lamborghini Aventador. However, the fastest police car in the fleet is the <u>Bugatti Veyron</u>. With a top speed of 253 miles per hour, it's painted the department's official colors <u>of green and white</u> and is tricked out with a light bar on top.

## Porsche's first car was electric

In 1898, 22-year-old Ferdinand Porsche's first car design was the Egger-Lohner electric vehicle C.2 Phaeton model, nicknamed the P1, <u>reports BBC</u>. The P1 could go up to 21 miles per hour and had a range of 49 miles on one charge.

## South African drivers have the option to install flamethrowers on their cars

During the 1990s, violent crime reached epidemic proportions in South Africa. Johannesburg, in particular, became notorious as the carjacking capital of the world. In response, inventor Charl Fourie developed the" Blaster", reports <u>CNN</u>. Also known as the "<u>BMW</u> Flamethrower," it could be mounted on the sides of vehicles.

# The world record to remove and replace a car engine is 42 seconds

On November 21, 1985, five Royal British Marines <u>removed</u> and replaced the engine of a <u>Ford Escort</u> in a mere 42 seconds. How did these men break the Guinness World Record? They practiced for two weeks. Whether the Ford Escort's engine is the easiest engine to remove and replace out of all cars is still up for debate.

## The world's largest speeding fine was \$1,000,000

income and how much the speed limit is exceeded. Police reported the 570-hp Mercedes — which has a top *In 2010*, *Swiss police pulled over a Swedish man and slapped him with a* \$1,000,000 speeding fine, the largest to date. The man's Mercedes SLS AMG was clocked at 186 miles per hour, more than two and a half times the local speed limit. In Switzerland, speeding fines are based on driver speed of 196 miles per hour — was traveling so fast it took a third of a mile to stop. The driver's other claim to fame was shattering the speeding record on Swiss roads.

## Only 18% of Americans know how to drive a manual.

According to U.S. News and World Report, only an estimated 18% of Americans can drive stick. Currently, 5% of the cars sold in the U.S. have manual transmissions, which creates even less incentive to learn how to drive stick. Traffic congestion discourages drivers from buying cars with a manual transmission, too.
