White Chocolate and Macadamia Rocky Road

250g packet marshmallows, halved 100g packet dried cranberries 110g packet macadamia nuts, roughly chopped 60g Pistachios (optional) 1/3 cup (35g) desiccated coconut 2 x 180g blocks good-quality white Chocolate, chopped

Grease a 20cm square cake pan. Line base and sides with baking paper, allowing a 2cm overhang on all sides.

Combine marshmallows, cranberries, nuts and coconut in a bowl. Place chocolate in a microwave safe bowl. Microwave on medium-high for 1-2 minutes, stirring with a metal spoon every 30 seconds, or until smooth.

Pour chocolate over marshmallow mixture. Mix well. Spoon mixture into prepared pan, pressing down with a spatula. Refrigerate for 2 hours or until set. Using a warm knife, cut into squares




