

Recipe Slow-cooked beef casserole

1 splash olive oil
500g beef steak, cut into chunks
1 potato diced large
1 carrot chopped large
1 pinch salt and pepper to taste
½ tsp oregano
1 tsp basil
1/3 tsp cayenne pepper
1 tsp garlic crushed
420g canned tomato soup
250ml Beef Style Liquid Stock
1 tbs cornflour
100ml water



Place all ingredients into the slow cooker, except cornflour & water. Cover and cook on high for 3 hours, turning a couple of times. Pour in cornflour & water, stir through. Cover and cook for another ½ hour.
