The raffle was run and the winners were"



Recipe

Melting Moments
345 grams Unsalted Butter (room temperature)
280 grams Plain Flour
¹/₄ teaspoon Salt
435 grams icing sugar, sifted
4 level tablespoons Custard Powder
1 teaspoon Vanilla Extract
4 tablespoons Full cream Milk



Vanilla buttercream

115 grams unsalted butter, room temperature 3 cups icing sugar sifted 1 teaspoon vanilla extract 3–4 tablespoons full cream milk

Preheat oven to 180 C Line two baking trays with baking or parchment paper.

In a large mixing bowl, beat butter medium speed for 1 minute or until creamy. Add flour, salt, sugar and custard powder and beat until a soft cookie dough forms. Roll roughly two teaspoons of cookie dough in your hands to form a ball and place on prepared tray. Repeat with remaining cookie dough. Press down on each cookie using a fork. Bake cookies for approximately 12 minutes. Leave to cool slightly before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely.

<u>Icing</u>, place butter in a large mixing bowl and beat on medium speed until pale and creamy. Add vanilla, half the sugar and one tablespoon of milk and beat until combined. Add the remaining sugar and another tablespoon of milk and beat until smooth. If the frosting is too thick, add an extra tablespoon of milk. Add buttercream to a piping bag fitted with a large round tip. Pipe buttercream onto one cookie. Add another cookie on top. Repeat with remaining cookies.

MOTOR REGULATIONS 1984

Cars, trailers etc., to be in safe condition.

500. Every motorcar and every trailer or other vehicle attached to and drawn by a motorcar shall in their form, construction, working, equipment and general condition and in all their parts be of such a nature that they will not cause or will not be likely to cause danger to any person in or upon such motorcar or trailer or other vehicle, or on the highway.

Towing of one car by another.

- 703. (1) A person shall not drive or use or cause to be driven or used on any highway any motorcar having attached to the rear thereof for the purpose of being towed, any other car having all its wheels in contact with the ground unless -
- (a) a licensed driver is in charge of the motorcar being* towed to control it and to prevent accident to any person upon such highway;
- (b) subject to sub regulation (2), the brakes of the motorcar being towed are not defective:
- (c) the space between the two motorcars is less than 3.50 metres or, where edither of such vehicles is a motor cycle, 2.25 metres;
- (d) where the two motorcars are joined by means of a rope, chain or wire there is affixed to such rope, chain or wire a red flag or piece of red cloth not less than 30 centimetres square so as to be clearly visible as a warning of danger, and
- (e) between sunset and sunrise a bright white light is projected by a lamp or lamps affixed to the motorcar being towed so that such light renders clearly visible such flag or piece of cloth or other material.
- (2) Where the brakes of the motorcar being towed are defective, the motorcar shall not be towed with all of its wheels on the ground unless it is connected to the other motorcar by means of a device which will hold it rigid
- (3) The Authority may upon application in writing issue a permit exempting a person from the requirement of complying with the provisions of sub-regulation (1) (a) and (c) and or Regulation 705 (1) (a) (i) where -
- (i) The front motorcar is a road grader owned or used by the municipality;
- (ii) the two motorcars are joined by means of a rigid A frame which effectively steers the motorcar being towed; and
- (iii) the road grader is equipped with a device which when operated by the drive: in his normal seating position operates the brake lights and turning indicators on the motorcar being towed.
- (4) A person shall not between sunset and sunrise drive or use or cause to be driven on any highway any motorcar having attached to the rear thereof for the purpose of being towed any other motorcar unless such motorcar has affixed to that portion thereof which faces any following vehicle, a lighted lamp or lamps being of a power not exceeding seven watts showing red light visible at a distance of 180 metres from such lamps, and being so placed that
- (a) the centre or centres of such lamps are not more than one metre above the ground; and
- (b) where only one such lamp is so affixed, it is in the centre or to the right side of the centre of the portion of the towed motorcar which faces any following vehicle; or where two or more lamps are so affixed, one of them is on the right side of such portion.
