However, the real winner was "The Prez" since he will never again be asked to provide a trivia quiz on a run – so one less task he needs to worry about performing!





Gran's cottage pie

1kg beef mince

2 rashers of bacon chopped

1 onion diced

1 carrot diced

2 celery sticks diced

1/2 red capsicum

2 beef stock cubes

3 tbs cornflour

1 tsp curry powder

1 tbs soy sauce

1 tbs tomato sauce

1 tbs Worcestershire sauce

2 cups water

3 cups mashed potato

1 splash milk

1 pinch salt and pepper to taste



Fry onion, carrot, celery and capsicum in a deep frypan with salt and pepper until softened. Fry bacon, add to cooked vegies. Add the mince and remaining ingredients. Simmer for 30 minutes.

Spoon mixture into a baking dish, and top with mashed potato.

Brush top with milk and bake at 185C for approximately 40 minutes or until potato has browned.


