Zucchini Bread

2 cups grated zucchini
2 cups all-purpose flour
1 1/2 tsp baking soda
1/2 tsp salt
1 tsp ground cinnamon
1/2 tsp ground nutmeg
1/2 cup unsalted butter, softened
1 cup granulated sugar
2 large eggs
1 tsp vanilla extract
1/2 cup brown sugar (for topping)
1 tsp cinnamon (for topping)



Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C). Grease and flour a 9×5-inch loaf pan. In a bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, and nutmeg. In another bowl, beat butter and sugar until creamy. Add eggs and vanilla, mixing well. Stir in zucchini, then gradually add the dry ingredients until just combined. Pour batter into prepared pan. Mix brown sugar and cinnamon and sprinkle on top. Bake 50–60 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out clean. Cool before slicing.
