apparently shared with neighbours. It is roughly grassed and big enough to easily accommodate, not one, but two high-set "workman's" cottages about 20 metres apart. Their long steep wooden staircases, showing the effects of sun and salt air, were placed at the front of the building, mid centred to access the couple of rooms inside of each. They haven't seen a lick of paint on their asbestos and weatherboard exteriors for so long, that only a weathered grey remains to contrast with the rusting corrugated iron roofs. Unlike some other establishments, who seem to think that basic seafood should attract the dollars, that one would pay for Fillet Steak, eating in the naturally cooled area, looking across the road, toward the beach, which boasted long tables and comfortable chairs, was a happy experience. \$23 bought me a decent slab of Barra with a side of Greek salad. Sarsha had a good feed of Calamari, which wasn't overcooked and rubberised, for about \$17.

We chatted and chomped till about 12:30 pm and, maybe unlike you and your weeding that wouldn't wait, enjoyed the day. So did Neils and Aileen, Allen and Lee, Alex, Kim and Carol, Sarsha and I, Frank and John.

These gracious people apologised for not being there.
