

## An invited run with the M.G Queensland Car Club

I am not sure that the second word in the heading above is an appropriate descriptor. The real connection is that Andy and Sally Byrne are also members of the MGCCQ, and the former is an expert in wiggling into an opportunity. The M.G club, whose club-rooms are at Rocklea, south of Brisbane, were conducting an event, on our side of the river. As a former



member, I recall that these Northside excursions don't happen too often. The octagonaly themed entity has been around since the late 1950s and has chapters as far north as Cairns We weren't counting as shaking hands and attempting to remember names was our primary intent, but using the 20 odd M.Gs parked outside as a guide, it was a good turnout.

The start, and a very good venue to keep in mind, was Pine Rivers Park in Brendale. This is a busy venue, which is not surprising, considering the maybe 30 metre long steel roofed area complete with gas BBQs and long tables, which fronts an expansive, read a couple of football grounds in size, lawn area complete with a ride-on train for kids, adjacent to a sizeable swings and slides facility. Let's be adventurous and let "the Sun- go -down" in Caboolture without us for a change.

The run for the day, wasn't going to keep those without roofs out in the weather too long, as our destination was Pioneer Park in Landsborough. Just for interest, to provide for south bound commuters, the town has a recently built car park at the railway station which would rival the North Lakes shopping precinct for capacity, I shit you not.

This opportunity for an inter-club experience was not picked up by anybody except we Jag drivers. I sincerely hope that we formally thank the inviting club for including us, thus opening the doors for future interaction. IMHO there is a lot to be learnt from experiencing how things are done in another group. As an example, the on-road procedure is a model, probably honed over time, which combines safety and common sense, and is worth some further words on another occasion.

The run had a happy feeling of belonging, to an event which was obviously a car club day out. If we were flying a flag it wouldn't have been any more obvious. There were, mainly MGBs, which is the model that Andy/Sally, Alex and I drive, in the unbroken, for most part, procession along the 104 kilometre route. We had lots of looks, smiles and thumbs-up from admiring road users. Can we have a magnetic sign on the lead and tail-end cars, as an example, or some other way, to give us some identity?



Andy reckons that we both picked up the wrong sets of keys as the steering wheel twirling in our Jaguars could have been minimised with our MGBs.

My total enjoyment of the inter-club experience was perfect, until I turned into Pioneer Park's car -parking area. Steering the big white beast was suddenly a near impossibility. Sarsha was ashen- faced, whilst jabbing the air repeatedly in the direction of the white smoke billowing from the edges of the bonnet. I feared the worst, but knew that the problem was related to the hydraulic power steering. Making use of the favourable gradient, we rolled down, with the engine off and a line of red fluid to mark our passage, to stop near the middle of the almost empty bitumen area. My face was probably the colour of the fluid flowing from between the front wheels, as I released the catch on the forward opening bonnet, to reveal the unfolding scenario to a rapidly growing group of spectators, each thankful that they were not in my very damp tennis shoes.

1100 pounds of pressure and a ruptured hose makes an awful mess of a previously immaculate engine bay. I was already dialling the number of the RACQ, getting value from my 30 years of unerring subscription to their roadside service. When the service lady asked if the car was drivable, I momentarily indulged in the notion of forwarding a photograph, before reassuring her in a more conventional manner, that such a card wasn't in the hand that I was holding. Yes there was going to be a delay, so after a wash up, joining the M.G people and Sarsha in the sheltered picnic area, with all the amenities, for the salad rolls she had prepared, seemed a good solution. So many name badges, attached to people who I hadn't seen in the 15 years since we were members, sat down for condolences and a catch up. There are worse ways to wait for a tow truck! Andy and Sally selflessly said they would wait, an offer I declined as messing up their day too wasn't going to help.

Exactly on cue, just as we ran out of coffee, the man in the yellow and blue truck, arrived, and without even enquiring, extended the ramps in front of the car with the leaks. I haven't sat on a bench seat for a while, but it worked for the 3 of us in getting our stained vehicle back home for the next bit of fun.

# NEWSLETTER No 26 November 2025 Statement of Acquisition

The Statement of Acquisition isn't a form with a form number, unfortunately.

If someone from TMR was to try and locate it, which I assume is the nature of your question, (or if someone wanted to get a copy from TMR) the form can be found in our TIPPS system, which everyone at TMR would be familiar with.

Reference to the form is contained on the page entitled "Proof of Origin" [Page ID: POQ1916]:

#### Previously registered/second hand vehicles

Application for registration can proceed if:

RAV entry exists

or

previous registration can be established on NEVDIS/TICA,

or

- the customer can present a previous registration certificate from any other jurisdiction,
- or
  - the customer can present a vehicle import approval that allows registration and use on the roads.

#### If none of these are available:

- A statement of acquisition <u>must</u> be completed.
  - The customer must provide as much detail as possible in the Statement of Acquisition. If they do not know the full name or address of the disposer, they must outline, in detail, how they came into possession of the vehicle. If there is any doubt about the information contained in the statement, it should be accepted or refused at managers discretion.

The Statement of Acquisition can be located by searching for "Sample Statement of Acquisition - July 2014" [Document ID A\_7052]
